Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.



And for them you will be the one.



### First Hendrickson Scholar Selected

The Hendrickson Scholarship Fund is an educational assistance program designed to encourage residents of Nebraska in their preparation for service in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Funds for this program are provided by the earnings of a gift to the Synod of Lakes and Prairies through the will of Carol Hendrickson, and from her husband, Bruce Hendrickson. The Hendricksons were very active in the First Presbyterian Church in Holdrege, Nebraska, as well as in the Synod and General Assembly.

According to Carol's obituary, she "lived her life caring for others, both individually and in community settings." Even while teaching in the public schools or at Central Community College, she was active in a wide variety of community organizations as well as University of Nebraska organizations. In the church she was an ordained elder, Sunday School teacher and superintendent and active in her Women's Circle.

Bruce, honored in 2017 with the Outstanding Philanthropist Award by the Nebraska Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, has been addressing community needs in Phelps County, Nebraska for many years. From a summer lunch program to a state-of-the art performing arts center in Holdrege, from sending Korean War veterans to Washington, DC, on an honor flight to providing a new bus and trailer for the Boy Scouts, Hendrickson finds joy in bringing together others as ideas arise. "If something comes up, we will get involved. A community or a person never stands still. You are either moving forward or moving



backward." (Kearney Hub, August 28, 2017) Ensuring the development of excellent pastors for the future of the church is one of his passions.

Regina Lynn Meester has been named as the initial Hendrickson Scholar. Gina is in her third year of a five-year program of studies at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary where she will earn a Master of Divinity and Master of Arts in Marriage and Family Therapy.

An exceptional student, Gina serves as student body Stated Clerk and has taken several practical mission study classes traveling to Cuba and Spain. She served as a Young Adult Volunteer in Africa and has also been active in Synod School and at the denomination level serving on committees and attending GA.

She grew up in Lincoln, where her father served as pastor of Heritage Presbyterian Church, so her Nebraska and Presbyterian roots both run very deep.
