Pentecost celebrates the start of the Christian church. As Peter and the disciples told of the Good News of Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit descended upon the people and the disciples were identified by fire above their heads. The gospel was heard by each person present, in their own language, and thousands believed! We are told the church increased in numbers as the disciples carried the message to other towns and cities throughout the Roman Empire. As we celebrate the 'birthday' of the Church, we celebrate the beginnings of our own congregation. Whether the congregation is fairly new, or over a century old, people came at it's start to help establish each congregation. Perhaps a minister from the old country was sent. Trained by others and sent by others to serve a new fellowship in America. Perhaps a congregation formed because of the growth in the community. In the 1950s and 1960s the General Assembly employed a network of ministers through its Board of Home Missions to preach and establish congregations.
