The Water Tower on the Prairie...

Recently at a session meeting I (Doc) had occassion to talk about the meaning of our term 'Ruling Elder'. I appreciate Pastor Steve's article. As we all are the water tower for the community, our Ruling Elders are the water tower for their congregation.

I went back home recently. I was shocked at how different Virginia looked to me after almost eight years in Nebraska. You can't see very far in Virginia unless you're on top of a mountain where all of the trees have been cut down. But when I ride my bike on the county roads north of Fairbury I can always see where I am. I just look for the water tower. If I ever got lost I would just ride straight for Jeff and the water tower.

It's hard to get lost if you have a landmark like that. And that's what Jesus means when He tells His disciples, "You're the world's light. It's impossible to hide a town built on top of a hill. People don't light a lamp and put it under a bucket. They put it on a lamp-stand, and it gives light for everybody in the house." (Matthew 5:14-15-Phillips Modern English) But the world has lots of people who don't appear to have a city on a hill or light to guide them. It doesn't look like they're sure where they are or where they're going. It looks like they have a tough time making good choices. The Bible calls that living in the dark. That is how some people end up lost and stay that way.

And so Jesus tells His disciples, "Let your light shine in the sight of everyone. Let them see the good things that you're doing and praise your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16-Phillips Modern English) Put another way. Jesus is saying, "I want you to be obvious. Be a light for everyone that is in the dark, lost, and trying to find their way home to God." Two thousand years have passed. Now that is our job description. Be the light of the world. Be obvious. Be easy to see. Help people figure out where they are. Help them find their way home to God. But in spite of that there are still lots of ways that we can end up in the dark. Drinking too much. Turning our backs on marriage. Ignoring our families. Not raising our children to love Jesus. Skipping worship, Not praying. Not paying attention to the Bible. Being selfish. Hurting someone by saying the first thing that comes to mind. That's living in the dark. What kind of life is that? That is why living the faith we confess is one of the most effective and helpful ministries we will ever take on. It's so simple we may worry, "Maybe I'm not getting it. Maybe I'm not getting what Jesus is talking about."

But it is that simple. A living faith is a bright light. And it is a great sermon. A living faith is a dazzling light. And it is a great Bible lesson. A living faith is a wonderful invitation to meet Jesus. That kind of living example is the life God created us for. It is the life Jesus wants us to live. That is why He said, "Be a city on a hill that people can't help seeing." And when we love Jesus enough to be a good example and a bright light, we end up loving God's people, too.

So we are literally a church on top of a hill. But we're also the city on a hill that Jesus is talking about. At our best, we're the kind of church and the kind of Christians that are a light in the dark. But I like this image even more: we're a water tower on the prairie. Being an easy-to-see landmark for people who are trying to find their way home to God-that is our job. So be Jesus' disciples. Live a beautiful, disciplined life. Do that and you will end up being the water tower that shows people the way home. Go ahead, be a water tower with Jesus painted all over it. That is everyday Christian living and leadership at its simplest and best.
