That's how many people in the United States who experience housing problems, including payments that are too large a percentage of their income, overcrowding, poor quality shelter and homelessness. Issues like housing insecurity impact everyday life, affecting health, nutrition, education, job performance, and more. Children face the greatest risk of the negative effects of housing insecurity.

Habitat for Humanity seeks to help. Using volunteer labor and tax-deductible donations of money and materials, Habitat for Humanity builds houses with the help of future Habitat homeowners. Houses are sold to these partner families at no profit, financed through affordable, no-interest mortgages. Monthly mortgage payments, paid by the families living in the homes, are used to support the construction of more houses.

In the Lincoln, Nebraska, area alone, Habitat has provided affordable housing for nearly 600 people, 403 of which are children, reducing the risk factors for these families, and providing the opportunity for a better quality of life.

It currently costs only \$73,000 plus the purchase of the lot to build a Habitat Home, as much of the labor (2,000 hours worth) is provided by volunteers and by the members of the families that Habitat works with.

In partnership with the Lincoln/Lancaster County Habitat for Humanity, churches and individuals from around Homestead Presbytery are working to build a home for a family in our area in a project that we are calling The PresbyBuild.

<u>Participate:</u> In the coming weeks and months, several churches are planning events and activities that will be fundraisers for The PresbyBuild. Keep an eye out for notifications about these activities, jump in, and get involved! Or, plan your own and let us know so that we can spread the word!

<u>Volunteer</u>: As we get to the construction phase, we will be looking for individuals and groups of people who can volunteer to get onsite and construct the house. There will be tasks available for just about every skill level, from hanging drywall to hammering nails to painting. Consider donating your time and your skills to help us reach the goal of 2,000 donated labor hours to help a family achieve the dream of a new home.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance responds to earthquake disaster in Nepal.

The death toll from the massive earthquake in Nepal continues to rise. Nearly 4,000 are known dead and more than 6,000 were injured when the 7.8 quake struck just west of the capital of Kathmandu on April 25. The quake, the worst in more than 80 years, along with many serious aftershocks has also caused damage in parts of India and Bangladesh.


PDA is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas with our partner,
