GIVE...World Mission funding gap may force co-worker recalls by 2017
In the 1970s, when the United Presbyterian Church was faced with bringing mission personnel home from international service due to funding, the Synod of the Trinity said, "Don't do that without first letting us know." Now, four decades later, 22 former moderators of the General Assemblies of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and its predecessor churches have written an open letter asking for fervent prayer and sacrificial giving to meet a funding gap of \$925,000 in 2016 that could widen to \$4.5 million in 2017, resulting in the recall of approximately 40 of the 162 mission coworkers.
