Pope's visit was on Common Ground

Presbyterians are among those that were eagerly anticipating the September 22-27 visit of Pope Francis to the United States. Gradye Parsons, Stated Clerk of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) General Assembly, was part of a delegation of religious leaders who welcomed Pope Francis to his first official engagement-a meeting with President Barack Obama at the White House.

One reason Presbyterians were eager to welcome the pope is because "he has brought a certain openness to the Catholic Church," said Robina Winbush, director of ecumenical relations for the Office of the General Assembly. Another reason the papal visit has stirred interest among Presbyterians, Winbush says, is because "the PC(USA) has a long history of dialogue with the Roman Catholic Church, both nationally and internationally."
