Wymore Church receives Grant for "Drive-in" Worship



congregations missed the most.

As with all the congregations in Presbytery during COVID restrictions, the three churches of Trinity Parish (Mission Creek, Steele City, and Wymore) had to close their doors. That left a painful hole in the spiritual lives of members. Live streaming worship was not going to be an effective option since most of the members did not have internet access. Face-to-face presence was what the

So the Parish came up with an alternative: have worship in the parking lot.

With permission from residents near the church, they set up a loudspeaker system to project across the front lawn of the Wymore church. Folks from all three churches began weekly "drive-in" worship, including special recognitions for Mother's Day, Father's Day, and High School Graduations. The congregants were thrilled with the opportunities to worship again... even if through windshields.

Unfortunately, not all were able to hear well.

Improvements brought the addition of shortrange FM radio transmission. That made all the difference. Worshippers were able to adjust the volume on their vehicle radios as they participated in behind-the-wheel worship.

Homestead Presbytery provided a grant to cover the cost of an FM transmitter and connecting equipment in the amount of

\$368. The grant came from the Program-Grant Committee through the Congregational and Leadership Development (CLD) M&M. Church Technology Upgrade Grants such as that received by Wymore are still available for churches discovering new ways to minister despite current health concerns. Applications are on the Presbytery website.



The congregations of Trinity Parish are thankful for Presbytery's assistance in providing heart-warming (yet social-distanced) worship opportunities until they are able to join unencumbered in their sanctuaries.

New Worshiping/Church Vitality Committee A series of articles on the 7 Marks of a Vital Congregation.

The Second Mark of the seven marks of a vital congregation is: "Intentional Authentic Evangelism vs. "Jesus Freaks," "Christian Hypocrisy", or a committee.

2 Cor. 4:7 says: "We have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to Christ." This is wonderful news that is intentionally and authentically shared from one's own heart and life. It is more than mere ethics or morals — though important. Yet, the driving impulse is the intentionality of *wanting* to share this news! It is with people we love and with whom we are related as friends, church family or as a neighbor. Even when masked by the protection of a face mask, the intentionality comes through the authentic excitement of one's eyes and smile that can still be seen through the mask. What good news do we want to share right now?

- The birth of a new baby
- A graduation
- A new job or promotion
- An anniversary or whatever else is such a joyful news, it has to be shared!

This is authentic and intentional through one's story. How has Jesus been real in your life and my life? That is a story that can be told with intentional heart. Our lives exude that excitement that we want others to know.

Resources that help in that story telling can bolster that witness: for further study, look at John 4:1-41; 2 Cor. 4:7; Gal. 2:19b-20; Mark 4:1-20; 1 Peter 3:13-22; Matthew 4: 19-20; Psalm 96; John 3:11-21; Romans 10:1-17.

Objectives:

The New Worshipping/Church Vitality Committee would like the churches of the presbytery to look at the following objectives and see how they could be incorporated into each church's story:

- To recognize that all disciples are called to Evangelism, not just committees and leaders; it is an authentic part of their life.
- To empower and equip all people to enter relationships unashamed and unafraid to share the Good News.

- The church recognizes that evangelism should be need-based (meets the needs of the un-churched/de-churched)
- The church develops practices for people to share their story and give witness to Good News in their lives.

Potential Outcomes

What might the outcomes of church vitality be for you and your congregation? It may be something like what is listed below or it may be an idea that is uniquely that of your congregation. This list to stir the imagination and think and pray what God is calling the church authentically do with energetic intentionality.

- Hospitality is not viewed as a replacement or a substitute of evangelism, but maybe an outgrowth.
- Evangelism is viewed as a way of life, not as a program or a function of the church.
- The mission of the church focuses on sharing the Good News.
- The people of God meld and claim God's story as their story, living unafraid to share it.
- The church develops authentic relationships founded in Christ. People see Christ through the church and their relationships.

Reflection Questions:

Here are some questions for the people and families to share and prayerfully consider:

- When did the news become Good News in your life?
- Does your church authentically allow individuals to come as they are with their particular stories and hear the Good News? Why or why not?
- In your church, how do people share their stories of faith? How is their story connected to the God story of redeeming love?
- How is your congregation equipped, empowered, and encouraged to intentionally share the Good News in daily life?
- Do you have an evangelism committee? If so, what are they tasked to do? How do you practice sharing the Good News vs. growing membership?
- What keeps us from sharing the Good News in our daily relationships?
- Can we call it "Good News" if we do not share it in our authentic relationships?
- Name a time when sharing the Good News was good for someone who needed to hear it.

Intentional authentic evangelism is the real story of Christ's redeeming love in each person who has the joy to share it with others. Prayerfully see what God's joyful Good News is going to impress on you and your congregation in Jesus' name.
