



Get Lost in a Book



No one likes to eat alone; to approach a table filled with people, only to be told that despite the open chairs there isn't room for you. The rejection stings. It leaves a mark. Yet this is exactly what the church has been saying to far too many people for far too long: "You're not welcome here. Find someplace else to sit." This is antithetical to what we see in the life and ministry of Jesus, where diversity is a given and where the inherent value of all people is placed front and center. How can we who claim faith in Christ expand the table and embody the community Jesus envisioned? How can we extend unconditional welcome and acceptance in a world increasingly marked by bigotry, fear, and exclusion?

Flood Update from the Disaster Response Team

Following the instruction of Galatians 6:2, where we are told to "bear one another's burdens", Presbyterian Disaster Assistance was born nearly 20 years ago. Perhaps like us before mid-March, 2019, you have a general understanding of PDA (as Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is known). Isn't PDA the "ones who wear blue shirts and build houses after disasters?" This is true – but they are so much more, as we've discovered in the last four months after being asked (and agreeing) to be the co-directors of Homestead Presbytery's Disaster Response Team. When you to visit the PDA website you see two key points – they say "Out of chaos...hope." And "PDA enables congregations and mission partners of the PCUSA to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crises and catastrophic events."

There are "immediate, short-term response groups" – like The Red Cross and The Salvation Army who are on the ground within hours of a disaster and offer immediate help with rescue, shelter, food and water. They help during the immediate crisis and then move on to the next disaster. **And** there are "long-term recovery groups" – that come in when plans are in place and funding is on the table for long term recovery. PDA is a long-term recovery group.

PDA is a part of **NEVOAD** (Nebraska Volunteers in Active Disaster) and works with many other groups to "bear one another's burdens" **AND** PDA is highly respected by FEMA – and we have been able to make some strong, working positive connections with people in need and direct cooperation with FEMA and PDA.

Blue shirts and building houses – yes, but so much more. PDA provides initial grants for immediate help in the time of disaster; grants for Presbyterian Church buildings and manses damaged by disaster; and spiritual and emotional help for those giving direct care at the time of disaster. Homestead Presbytery has applied for and been granted monies for these things.

Blue shirts and building houses – yes, but so much more. PDA actively works to help establish Long Term Recovery Groups by their presence (in this case with us at meetings). And with funding (from grants applied for to use within the presbytery.) We have been a part of establishing four such groups within Homestead Presbytery – **Dodge** County (Fremont and North Bend); (READ ENTIRE ARTICLE HERE)
